Technical Guidelines and Rules for the Parallel Session 2nd ICSS 2023

1. Presenters will be grouped into “Zoom Room” based on the predefined “Zoom Room” number. Meanwhile, non-presenter participant will be grouped into “Zoom Room” randomly. The steps to enter “Zoom Room” can be seen in **“Technical Guidelines of Entering and Exiting Zoom Room.”**
2. Participants who are scheduled to present at the current session are required to attend a parallel session in the "Zoom Room" which has been determined until the session is end.

6. Presenter can present the material by using .ppt or .pdf file.

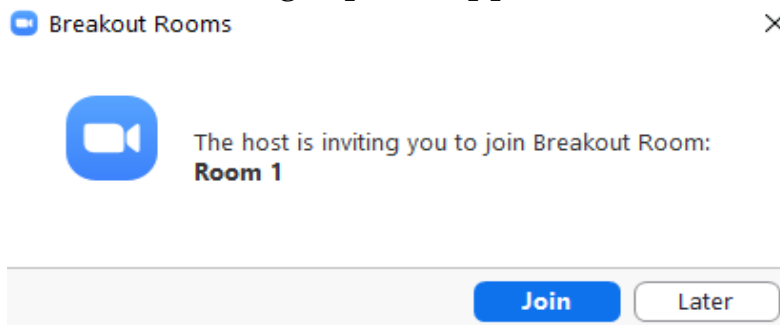

MINIMIZING THE RISK FACTORS FOR LOW BACK PAIN IN THE CREATIVE INDUSTRY WORKERS

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ABSTRACT

Low back pain (LBP) felt in the anatomical area of a person's body is affected by a load or pressure outside the tolerance limit, with various variations in the length of time the pain complaint process occurs. This pain is felt in the lumbar or lumbo-sacral area. Workers in the batik industry may be at risk of LBP caused by work activities, such as bending, repetitive or monotonous movements, using work equipment and a non-ergonomic work environment. This study aims to minimize the risk factors for LBP in batik creative industry workers. The population of this study were all batik artisans in the written batik industry in Wukirsari Village, Imogiri District, Bantul Regency, Yogyakarta Special Region, totaling 1,021 people. The sample of this study was obtained by random sampling, to determine the sample using a lottery number and the name of the batik maker, totaling 60 batik people. The inclusion criteria for the sample of this study included female gender, writing batik work, working sitting using a chair. The sample consisted of a treatment group and a control group, each consisting of 30 batik makers, hereinafter referred to as respondents. The research instruments include: meter, microthoiche, scales, chair, batik hurdle, and NBM questionnaire. Ergonomic work chair design for batik size: height

of seat holder = 30 cm; length of seat holder = 40 cm; seat width = 37 cm; high back of chair = 43 cm; seat back width = 37 cm. Modification of batik gawangan is to redesign batik gawangan, material from bamboo diameter of about 3 cm, with size: height = 88 cm, width = 158 cm, 4-legged pieces, equipped with 3 watt LED lights. The results of the NBM in the treatment group decreased skeletal muscle complaints into criteria: low 96.7% and moderate 3.3%. The control group had skeletal muscle disorders criteria: low 23.3%, moderate 46.7%, high 20% and very high 10%. While the results of the t-test from the NBM data each of the 30 respondents between the treatment group and the control group, the value of $p = 0.000$ means that there are significant differences between respondents who use chairs and ergonomic modification modifications with respondents who use dingklik and gawangan which is old. The conclusion is that the use of chairs and modifications of the ergonomic batik wrestling can minimize the risk factors for LBP in the workers of the written batik creative industry.

In accordance with PP No. 45 of 1990, if a Civil Servant wants to divorce beforehand he must report and ask for permission from his superiors to carry out the divorce. But in practice, permission from superiors as a requirement for civil servant divorce is difficult to issue from superiors who wish to divorce. So that in some cases the court gave divorce decisions to Civil Servants without a letter of permission from their superiors. This is the topic of the problem that the author wants to examine in this paper. The formulation of the problem is how and what is the basis for judges in deciding divorce cases for civil servants who do not have permission from their superiors? The legal research method used is normative juridical, namely a scientific research procedure to find the truth based on the scientific logic of law from a normative perspective. The approach used is a statutory approach that relates to the main issues related to the judge's decision in civil servant divorce cases

without the permission of the leadership. Legal materials in this writing use primary legal materials and secondary legal materials. From the results of the study it was concluded that the powers of the judiciary as stipulated in Law no. No. 48 of 2009 provides power and freedom for judges to decide civil servant divorce cases whose goal is to achieve justice with legal considerations and also supporting evidence, so that whether or not there is a statement of permission from superiors to divorce, is not the main guideline in determining a judge's decision

This study aims to understand the implementation of APKM (Access, Participation, Control, and Benefit) and gender equality in the Student Executive Board (BEM) in UIN Sunan Ampel Surabaya (UINSA). The study used a qualitative approach by interviewing members of BEM across nine faculties, administering questionnaires, and collecting relevant documents regarding gender equality. The results indicated that six of BEM had socialised gender equality in their community, and three of them had not promoted it yet. Even though the six BEM claimed that they had promoted gender equality in their community, practically the organisation management did not fully apply gender equality as proved by the election of the leader of executive board is consistently dominated by male students. Female is chosen to hold the job of secretary or treasurer. This is evidence that the management of the organisation has not fully implemented gender equality; there is still a belief that different genders should hold particular positions. The results also demonstrated that women frequently handle household duties like meal preparation and office work when organising events. Contrarily, men are

employed to carry out routine jobs. The study shows that although male students currently dominate the competition for the top positions in BEM, both male and female members of the organisation have access to, participation in, control over, and benefits related to gender equality. This may be influenced by patriarchy culture in the community and less awareness of gender equality among members of BEM in UINSA

INVESTIGATING CRITICAL PEDAGOGY IN THE DEVELOPMENT OF THE PESANTREN EDUCATION SYSTEM

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ABSTRACT

Critical pedagogy perspectives are currently being promoted in educational technology to advocate inclusion and social justice. However, little has been considered about the prospects of implementing it in the pesantren (Islamic boarding schools) education system. This research investigates the contribution of Paulo Freire's ideas in developing the pesantren as an indigenous Indonesian educational institution that has experienced marginalization. The study used a semi-systematic or narrative review to examine various theoretical literature and empirical research, then analyzed all source materials using content analysis techniques. The findings reveal that pesantren has developed Freirean critical pedagogy in adult education training to increase critical awareness, encourage civil society participation, break the culture of silence, and communicate people's aspirations through various media

and technologies. The study identifies gaps between critical pedagogy and educational technology in general. Still, it gives justifications about prospects to encourage further research and development in Islamic pesantren education settings in Indonesia.
